## ***Background...***

The **Capitol City Band** played its first concert season in 1969. In 1981, Dr. Elmer Ziegler asked Jim Latimer to assist with the conducting duties, something Latimer does with vigor and excitement. He is assisted by associate conductor, Dave Pedracine. The musicians are some of the finest from the greater Madison area.

It is the CCB philosophy to open and close each season without debt. That's our promise. We only play if we have the money.

It costs more than \$1600 for each concert—the money has to be raised. As much or more is given in volunteer services for work such as administration, fund raising, office work, assembling/filing the music, concert logistics, filming, editing and producing for broadcast all year long on four (4) community television stations and more.

**CCB** plays a new program of music each concert without rehearsal. Rehearsals require raising more money. With only three rehearsals prior to the start of each new summer season, CCB thrives on the expertise of each dedicated player who puts forth his or her best to project excellent music. *To generate maximum music for minimum dollars is the CCB success story* – which we do because of you.
